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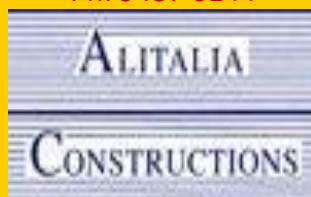

2011 has been another successful year for the Research Junior Football Club with both on field and off field achievements.

## ON FIELD

The club fielded 9 teams in season 2011 from Under 9s to Under 17s. Of the 8 teams eligible to play finals we had 4 teams make the finals. Of the 4 teams who made the finals, 3 of these teams made it through the first week of finals, with 2 of the 3 teams making it all the way to the grand final - congratulations to the Under 11s and Under 16s for getting this far but unfortunately without the ultimate success of a premiership flag.

After being forced to close the ground to training and a number of games in 2010 due to the poor condition of the surface, we must all thank Campbell Waters and the 2010 committee for the tough decisions that were made last year that resulted in the installation of the drainage over the Summer months and the improvement in playing conditions for 2011.

The ground is already in better condition than previous years and we can look forward to an even better surface in 2012 – if you are going past Research Park, call in and check out the new, non-leaking veranda and paving in front of the clubrooms.

The quality of the ground also saw the club host a week of finals and with a great team effort we secured a nice financial windfall for the club. The money raised from the canteen sales on the day will be put towards an upgrade of our audio visual equipment in the clubrooms as well as the purchase of a video camera to record games held at Research Park.

Another vital piece of equipment purchased this year was the Defibrillator machine. There have been many publicised cases of how lives could have been saved had a 'defib' machine been available. Our machine is now hooked up to the internet making it the first machine in a junior club in Australia with the capability to send important data directly to the hospital involved. Here is hoping that we never have the need to see this machine in action.

The weekly BBQ's continued on from last year and the ante was certainly upped. The quality of the 'spread' each week had to be seen to be believed and all went home well fed and watered on Sunday nights. The social aspect of these BBQ's cannot be underestimated and they contribute greatly to 'The Family Club' feel of RJFC.

I would like to extend my thanks to the sponsors of the club in 2011. The financial support of our club has put us in a position where we will be able to invest back into the club in the form of infrastructure, equipment and specialist coaching in the future. We are in process of exploring an upgrade to the lighting at Research Park and the financial position of the club should allow us to make this a reality. # TREASURER'S REPORT

RJFC season 2011 can be assessed as having been financially successful as we have reported a surplus of \$34,379. This represents an increase of more than 100% from the prior year, under-pinned by a 15% increase in revenue with only a 3% increase in expenses.

This year the committee decided not to increase registration fees, which are not sufficient to meet the running costs of the club. Consequently we must rely upon other funding sources. The canteen and bar continue to be a vital source of funds to the club, together with generous support from our sponsors, sales of electronic scoreboards, and merchandise.

The growth in sales of scoreboards is a result of Gary White's fantastic effort and generosity, and we look to continuing this in-house in 2012.

The increase in canteen and bar income is due to more home games this season with the significant improvement in ground conditions, as well as securing a finals day during this year's NFL finals series. Appreciation to John Girdlestone and Caroline Sharp for successfully managing the bar and canteen, and to the many parents and helpers who man the canteen on a weekly basis.

This year the club invested in a defibrillator as a resource for the local community groups using Research Park facilities. We hope this will never have to be used, but will provide security and peace of mind going forward.

The committee has decided not to increase registration fees in 2012. Also, in recognising the difficulty facing some families, the committee has capped fees for families with more than 2 children.

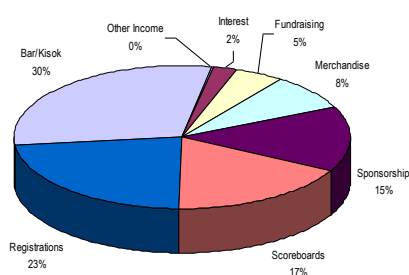
Furthermore, in 2012 the committee has undertaken to invest more funds in football operations and equipment so that our children can benefit more on the field, in their enjoyment of the game, and hopefully win more premierships!

I think that it is imperative that the club continues to develop income streams outside of the traditional areas (such as registration fees) that for many clubs represent their primary income source. It is the players and their families who will determine the financial success of this club via their support of not only the teams but also our social functions and our sponsors. We also need to ensure that funds continue to be available to be invested in the club and in particular, the coaching staff, players, and infrastructure.

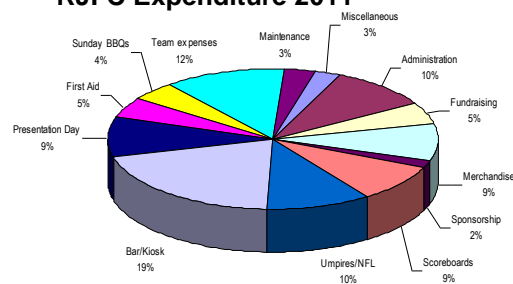
Finally I would like to acknowledge the support that I have received from the committee, players and parents this year and look forward to success for the club in season 2012.

# CLUB HISTORY

Year	Highlights
1979	Decision made by a dedicated group of residents that Research needed a Junior Football Team.
1980	Club formed and games played at Research Park. 2 teams only – Under 10s and Under 12s. Played in a red jumper with a white V neck and cuffs. Canteen was a trestle table. Played in the Wattle Glen and District Football League.
1981	
1982	Original Clubrooms opened by councillor Robert Allan
1983	First premiership won – Under 16s in the Wattle Glen and District Football League. Jumper changed to the old Footscray red white and blue jumper – hence the origins of the bulldog logo.
1984	5 under 10s and 5 under 12s selected for representative teams.
1985	Premiers in the under 15s. 4 teams fielded. The club became incorporated to safeguard the future of the club.
1986	Joined the Diamond Valley Football League (DVFL). Jumper changed to a Red and White striped jumper. 5 teams fielded. First 2 players to reach 100 RJFC games. First player asked to train with Collingwood under 19s.
1987	Research Park was closed for the season as the council made improvements so home games were played at Eltham Lower Park. The under 11s become the first team to play in a DVFL final.
1988	112 registered players over 5 teams. 2 more players asked to train with Collingwood under 19s. Rock 'n' Roll night was a major fund raiser. RJFC windcheaters introduced (red & white).
1989	10 <sup>th</sup> anniversary year. 9 finals teams in the first 10 years. First female player – Tory Thomas. Simon Prestigiacommo (Collingwood player) wins the under 11s B&F. Max Hudghton (St Kilda player) 2 <sup>nd</sup> in the under 13s B&F.
1990	4 teams fielded with 1 team making the finals. A junior committee of players was formed to give ideas to the club committee.
1991	5 teams fielded and 3 teams make the finals. Raffles held at home games to help with fund raising.
1992	Fund raising done to raise money for a much needed extension to the change rooms. Opposition teams take it in turn to get changed with RJFC teams.
1993	2 teams make the finals. Club awarded DVFL Most Disciplined Club for the first time. 9 boys selected for DVFL representative teams. 'Vic Kick' (forerunner of Auskick) provides enough players to field 2 under 9 teams for a total of 6 teams for the year.
1994	2 teams make the finals including the under 17s for the first time. DVFL B&F winner in the under 15s. 11 boys selected for DVFL Representative teams. \$22,000 grant from the Shire of Eltham secured to help fund the clubroom extension.
1995	Clubroom extension completed. 3 teams make the finals. Under 17 player finishes with 192 games – a club record. Another DVFL B&F winner in the under 15s.
1996	7 teams fielded for the first time. 4 teams make the finals. A new jumper worn with red and white V. 'Grubby & DD' provide the entertainment at the Dinner

	finals. Skating night and kids trivia nights held during the season.
1998	8 teams fielded. Film night held at the clubrooms with an old style projector used. Club awarded Most Disciplined Club in the DVFL for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> time. Back in Division 3.
1999	20 <sup>th</sup> year of the club. New scoreboard built with changeable metal numbers. New training lights installed.
2000	Canteen extended. 174 registered players. 5 out of 7 teams make the finals. Club awarded Most Disciplined Club for the 3 <sup>rd</sup> time.
2001	Club moves into 2 <sup>nd</sup> division. Jumper changed to maroon with yellow v and white trim. 2 teams make finals.
2002	Back to 3 <sup>rd</sup> division. Home games played at Panton Hill and Latrobe University as the ground is closed for renovations. 6 teams make finals. 3 premierships.
2003	Promoted to 2 <sup>nd</sup> division. Home games back at Research Park. New pergola built in front of clubrooms. Club awarded Most Disciplined Club for the 4 <sup>th</sup> time. 3 teams make grand finals. 2 premierships.
2004	Promoted to 1 <sup>st</sup> division for first time. 3 teams make the finals. New away team rooms, time keepers' box and BBQ area built.
2005	Back to 2 <sup>nd</sup> division. 10 teams fielded for the first time with 260 registered players. 5 teams make finals. 1 premiership. New carpet laid in the social rooms.
2006	9 teams fielded. 3 premierships. Combined results earn promotion to 1 <sup>st</sup> division.
2007	Late start to the season due to the drought and ground restrictions. Northern Football League replaces the DVFL. 10 teams fielded with 4 premierships – the best result in the club's history. 1 player picked as Vic Metro representative and 1 player wins the Under 13 DVFL B&F.
2008	New grading system introduced. The drought continues to affect the grounds with another late start. 10 teams fielded. 8 teams make the finals. 2 premierships. New electronic scoreboard opened – the envy of the NFL. New goal posts installed. 2 players win NFL B&F awards.
2009	252 registered players. 5 teams make finals. 2 premierships. 1 player wins an NFL B&F award. Plans for a 2 <sup>nd</sup> story extension to the clubrooms unveiled. 12 players in the Northern Knights squads.
2010	30 <sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrated with a dinner dance. 9 teams fielded. 7 teams make finals. 2 premierships. Under 13s make club history with 4 <sup>th</sup> premiership in a row. Ground closed at the end of round 8 due to poor conditions – the drought has broken. 1 player selected in Vic Metro under 15 team. 26 players in NFL representative teams. 1 player wins NFL B&F.
2011	9 teams fielded. 4 teams make finals. Lower Plenty (our senior club) wins 3 premierships in Division 2 and earns promotion to 1 <sup>st</sup> Division. 1 player wins NFL B&F. Major drainage works on the ground implemented over summer and ground remains open for whole season. New visitors terracing completed. 1 week of finals hosted.

### 2011 - A Year to remember in the Club's history

At the end of 2010 Football Operations saw the need for change even though we were coming off the back of Runners-Up in both the Seniors and U/19's and our Reserves going down in a very close game in the Preliminary Final.

The week following the Grand Final saw the beginning of our 2011 campaign with the decision to appoint a new coaching panel and target recruit. Enter Garry Ramsay, Steve Layt and Grant Barden following an extensive interview process headed up by our good friend Terry Wallace.

Four consecutive 1<sup>st</sup> division premierships and then bottom of the ladder – how the mighty have fallen. To tell you the truth, when I applied for the coaching position in late 2010, I was of the view that more than half the squad of 26 were struggling on the field and that it would be a very difficult adjustment season for the kids and some parents, including my coaching team. With a view to the longer term, my own goals were purely to try and develop as many kids as possible, focus on instilling self-belief and confidence in individuals and preach what I valued as basic footy fundamentals, such as *everyone* contributing each quarter on a weekly basis, winning contested footy, adaptability, being accountable for an opponent and playing unselfishly. In an environment in 2011 where we were getting well beaten routinely and with low player numbers, enforcing, achieving and recognising these goals at training and on match day was difficult and to be truthful, only partially realised. But we made a lot of progress and in the last six rounds were highly competitive, shaving 8 goals off our average deficit. Some kids are only just beginning to realise their potential.

For me, the most pleasing aspect was the improved form and strong growth in self-confidence among many players and I hope this builds a stronger platform for the future. Half the team (Jarrod, Pat, Cam, Lachie, Chase, Tommy, Will, Callum and Max Summers) had their best individual season in Research colours, in terms of impact and consistency, whilst other players can be proud of their efforts too. Will Collins was thrust in an unlikely Ruck role where he thrived and competed well against bigger, stronger opponents all season. Darcy French in his first season was his partner in crime and developed rapidly, showing he will be a big asset for us in the future. Max Cotter, also in his first season, slotted into the Back Pocket and performed like a seasoned campaigner, showing promise in the middle when given an opportunity in the 2<sup>nd</sup> last round. Cam Klapste was outstanding at CHB then later onball, consistently beating quality opponents and repeatedly showing fantastic intensity in his 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> efforts. Jarrod Oake had a break-out season, mostly on the Half Back line, becoming one of the team's best players marking many opposition kicks and reliably subduing quality opponents. Lachie Reinke graduated from his regular, reliable role in the Back Pocket to becoming a valuable onballer. Pat Symons has always been a very good player in this team but this year extended his resume to delivering superb football in one of the hardest positions on the field, CHF (and kicking 12 goals). Tom Bevan-Shannon provided quality support on the HF flank (12 goals), playing smart football, running hard and consistently providing his team with an avenue to attack. Trent Warren, who in my mind has been the premier Full Back in this competition for the last four years, showed his potential up forward, kicking 9 goals, despite spending more than half of the season in the backline or in some cases on the Wing. Max Summers was a revelation as a consistent, courageous, versatile player who provided dash, competitiveness and quality disposal off the half-back line, onball and other positions. Chase Chequer continued to deliver a super reliable defensive role and Luke Russell showed versatility being shifted around from quarter-to-quarter all year, providing a good team role on the Wing in the last five rounds. Callum Newton provided drive off the Wing, took marks, 'showed some toe' and kicked beautifully all year, demonstrating the flexibility to also play up forward and at Full Back – one of this year's big improvers. Joel Clamp was a livewire up forward (4 goals) and exploited his running ability to accumulate possessions around the ground, plus he was a great bubbly personality around the group. Jordan Sacco is a champion

person and player and possesses the most complete game in the whole competition, being duly rewarded with this year's B&F (by a huge margin). He once again showed his fine leadership qualities by relentlessly, unselfishly willing himself to each contest all game long every week, playing tough, fast, skilful football, despite constant attention from the opposition and kicking 13 goals. Sam Northcott filled the unrewarding role of Full Back for much of the season, routinely out-bodying his opponent and marking well overhead. Cody Johnstone battled with leg soreness in the first half of the season, then showed us what we were missing in the second half, finishing with 11 goals from the Half Forward Flank and Onball. Ned Waters and Kyle Keenan both struggled to find their rhythm in the first half of the season but snapped into top form in the second half, Ned displaying a great, consistent work-rate as an 'extra' Onballer accumulating possessions (and kicking 8 goals) and Kyle fluctuating between the Back Pocket, Onball and Half Forward, showing his trademark hardness at the footy and sharp crumbing skills. Lloyd Hillard struggled a bit with leg issues on-and-off all season which prevented him from contributing his normal output, but his heart was as big as ever, his attack on the footy was great, his team ethic really strong and the speed in his legs when they felt ok was scintillating. On the whole, everyone in the team should feel really proud of their individual efforts this season.

Our critical team weakness was an inability to sustain quality football over four, twenty minute quarters and for most of the season we simply didn't have the depth of class onball – you can't win games of footy without at least breaking even in the middle. Sixteen out of twenty players had opportunities in the midfield, but irrespective of who we played there, the opposition dominated us as a group in the first 8 rounds, kicking 8 goals a game from onballers. However, Lachie Reinke was a great addition in the second half of the season and Cam Klapste also added some spark and hunger, showing all the attributes to become an exceptional onballer in the future. Ned Waters, Luke Russell, Max Summers, Kyle Keenan and Max Cotter all performed well at times, which together with Jordan and Cody, establishes a plethora of options for us going forward. We closed the gap onball substantially in the second half of the season and just one new midfielder or the sudden emergence or further development of an existing player (and the return of Snowy) could make all the difference to the whole team's fortunes next year.

Thankyou to all the kids for their endeavours this year, their positive attitude, their friendliness and their support. I think you have now learned to share the load better and become more rounded footballers and I look forward to seeing how you all continue to develop in the future. Hopefully you will have more team success just around the corner. Congratulations also to Jordan, Jarrod and Pat for taking out the Best & Fairest awards and to other trophy winners Cam, Lachie, Chase and Joel. You were all deserved recipients.

I want to finish by saying thanks to Carolyn for her steady support through a difficult year. Special thanks to Brett and Gary, for both providing great assistance and support at training and on match days. Their passion and football insights are fantastic and they were both a great help with the kids. Thanks and acknowledgement also to Leanne and Carol for doing another excellent job in the unrewarding role of Team Manager. Further thanks to Rod/Angela for a great job as Trainer and Rod and George for their moral support and help at training, George as Boundary Umpire, Anthony as Goal Umpire, Harry as Waterboy, Deb/Mark for the oranges/snakes supply and to all the parents for the other jobs that needed attending. Big thank you to Jack Sharp from the U15s who facilitated a second training session for our boys with his team on a weekly basis – the few who were dedicated enough to go (well done Jarrod, Cam, Luke, Joel, Jordan, Cody and Kyle), got a lot out of it. Lastly, thanks to the Committee for the enormous work it does behind the scenes, which largely goes unnoticed and unappreciated. Good luck next year boys. Steve Russell

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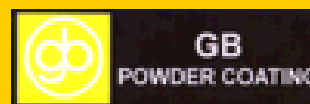
